CALLING ALL MEMBERS

As a member of Green Bay Botanical Garden, we hope you have enjoyed the many wonderful benefits of your membership this past year.

As a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, we operate without any government funding and rely solely upon the generosity of our community to contribute to the Annual Fund. This annual support provides the funds necessary to help us meet our mission and enhance the quality of life in northeast Wisconsin.

**Our goal this year is to raise \$190,000 - representing 20% of our annual budget.**

*Last year only 4.5% of our members gave an additional gift to help grow and sustain the Garden.* While revenues generated from memberships, special events and admission fees are important, they represent just 57% of our annual operation budget. Therefore, we also depend on each member to give added support through our Annual Appeal. This is critical to the Garden, ensuring we are able to continue to fund educational programs, provide outreach to the local community and programming for at-risk students, maintain and enhance the gardens, and sustain a volunteer program that provides a sense of community!

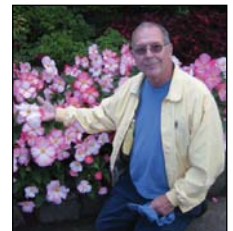

### Baer Perennial Garden

What gardener doesn't savor winter? Well quite a few I imagine, but it is a time when we can put away the tools, take a moment to breathe, and start dreaming and planning for next year's gardens and projects. Here at GBBG we are designing and purchasing for the newest garden addition - the Baer Perennial Garden. The retaining walls, seat walls, paths and steps were installed this fall by Landscape Associates. Using Dennis Buettner's plan, we'll purchase 1,000 perennials of 150 different species, varieties, and cultivars as well as about 50 trees, shrubs, and roses of 26 different species, varieties, and cultivars for this new garden. It is exciting to see all of the plants that are available, but it can be challenging to get everything ordered - especially when ordering smaller quantities of different plants. So, as you are paging through your catalogs and falling into your mid-winter's nap, remember to add some perennials to your garden and please come out to see what we've bought next spring. Hey, you may even want to help us get them in the ground! 🌱
